

Waves of Grace—A Sacred Celebration of 150 Years

Dear Parishioners,

In 2026, our beloved Church of Mary Immaculate and St. Athanasius in Manly will reach a moment of profound grace: 150 years since the establishment of this parish.

Since 1876, Mary Immaculate has been more than a building. It has been a spiritual home, a sanctuary where the people of Manly, Freshwater, and the Northern Beaches have gathered to encounter Christ, to celebrate sacraments, and to walk together in faith. From baptisms and weddings to funerals and feast days, it has been a place of consolation, joy, challenge, and communion.

Our theme for this anniversary is:

"Waves of Grace: 150 Years of Faith, Community, and Service."

These words reflect both the past we cherish and the future we long to build. But most importantly, they invite us to go deeper; to see this moment not just as a milestone, but as a spiritual turning point.

A Sacred Vision for This Celebration

At the heart of our 150th Anniversary lies a spiritual vision:

That as a parish, we come together to thank God for the past, renew our faith in the present, and commit ourselves with courage and generosity to the future.

Our Spiritual Journey Week 3 – How to Pray

We continued our Spiritual Journey series this past Monday by looking at the topic of "How to Pray". Prayer is truly an amazing adventure. How could it not be? We are talking about our

relationship with God, the God who created the whole universe – and the angels in Heaven. And to think that this God wants to have a personal relationship with me through the person of Jesus Christ. He knows me by name. From my mother's womb He called me (Is 49).

So the question is, then, how do I pray? In this session we explored **four basic ways that people pray**:

- (i) Formal prayers like the Lord's prayer, Hail Mary, Glory Be, etc,
- (ii) Conversations where we talk to God in our own words,
- (iii) The Bible reading and meditating on the Word of God.
- (iv) Silence where we just sit or kneel in silence before the Lord, allowing ourselves to feel God's presence and being aware of His love and care for us.

Note here that the **emphasis** is on personal prayer, and not group or community prayer like attending Sunday Mass, etc. These are very important, but equally important is that we make time for this personal, **one-on-one prayer with the Lord.** For even Jesus in the Scriptures would often **withdraw from the crowds** and His disciples and either go up a mountain or some other deserted place to be alone with His Father in prayer (cf. Lk 6:12).

We also discussed that to be able to enter into a **deeper relationship with Jesus** through prayer it was essential that we **grow in knowledge of Him** by frequently reading and meditating on the **Word of God**. For as the Catechism teaches, the Word of God gives us the **surpassing knowledge** of Jesus Christ (Compendium, 558). And again, St Jerome, the fourth century Church Father said: "*ignorance of Scripture is ignorance of Christ.*" The Scriptures are a privileged source of encountering the person of Jesus Christ. It is through the Word of God that we will learn to deepen our knowledge and relationship with Jesus, which will deeply enrich our Spiritual life, for He is the source of faith, hope and love.

By the end of our session we resolved as a group to commit to a daily routine of personal prayer, no more than 5 - 10 mins to start with. It should be done at a regular time and place where possible. We also emphasised the importance of discipline in prayer life, which means not praying when I "feel" like it, or for as long as I "feel" I'm getting consolation from my prayer — St Teresa of Avila warns us against seeking the consolations of God rather than the God of consolation. But rather, our commitment to prayer is a "dedication" born out of a sense of love and duty to the One who loves me with an infinite love, and wishes me to share in His very own Spiritual Life; that is, life eternal. Is that not an amazing journey worth starting?

May **Our Lady Spouse of the Holy Spirit** teach us the extraordinary joy and peace that comes with knowing and loving the Lord. Amen! *Alfred Soliman Seminarian*

The group is informal and begins with conversation, a short reflection from Fr Sam, and time for open questions. It's the first step before the formal RCIA program kicks off in September.


The group meets on Thursday evenings at 7:00pm at St Mary's Parish Centre.




PILGRIMS VISITING THE SHRINE


Epping Carlingford Parish Young Adults -13th Sept



A reading from the prophet Amos

Then by lowering the bushel, raising the shekel, by swindling and tampering with the scales, we can buy up the poor for money, and the needy for a pair of sandals, and get a price even for the sweepings of the wheat.' Second Reading

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to Timothy

Let prayers be offered to God for everyone; he wants all people to be saved.

My advice is that, first of all, there should be prayers offered for everyone - petitions, intercessions and thanksgiving - and especially for kings and others in authority, so that we may be able to live religious and reverent lives in peace and quiet. To do this is right, and will please God our saviour: he wants everyone to be saved and reach full knowledge of the truth. For there is only one God, and there is only one mediator between God and mankind, himself a man, Christ Jesus, who sacrificed himself as a ransom for them all. He is the evidence of this, sent at the appointed time, and I have been named a herald and apostle of it and - I am telling the truth and no lie - a teacher of the faith and the truth to the pagans.

In every place, then, I want the men to lift their hands up reverently in prayer, with no anger or argument.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

You cannot be slaves both of God and of money.

Jesus said to his disciples, 'There was a rich man and he had a steward who was denounced to him for being wasteful with his property. He called for the man and said, "What is this I hear about you? Draw me up an account of your stewardship because you are not to be my steward any longer." Then the steward said to himself, "Now that my master is taking the stewardship from me, what am I to do? Dig? I am not strong enough. Go begging? I should be too ashamed. Ah, I know what I will do to make sure that when I am dismissed from office there will be some to welcome me into their homes."

Then he called his master's debtors one by one. To the first he said, "How much do you owe my master?" "One hundred measures of oil" was the reply. The steward said, "Here, take your bond; sit down straight away and write fifty." To another he said, "And you, sir, how much do you owe?" "One hundred measures of wheat" was the reply. The steward said, "Here, take your bond and write eighty."

'The master praised the dishonest steward for his astuteness. For the children of this world are more astute in dealing with their own kind than are the children of light.

'And so I tell you this: use money, tainted as it is, to win you friends, and thus make sure that when it fails you, they will welcome you into the tents of eternity. The man who can be trusted in little things can be trusted in great; the man who is dishonest in little things will be dishonest in great. If then you cannot be trusted with money, that tainted thing, who will trust you with genuine riches? And if you cannot be trusted with what is not yours, who will give you what is your very own?

'No servant can be the slave of two masters: he will either hate the first and love the second, or treat the first with respect and the second with scorn. You cannot be the slave both of God and of money.'

GOSPEL REFLECTION

The parable of the shrewd business manager is one of the most difficult parables of Jesus to grasp. At first reading, it appears that Jesus is condoning extortion and larceny. But Jesus admires not the manager's lack of scruples but his decisiveness and

ingenuity in taking control of his situation. We admire those who use their intelligence, charm and pluck to get ahead in this world. Jesus' parable challenges us to be as eager and as ingenious for the sake of God's reign, to be as ready and willing to use our time and money to accomplish great things in terms of the Gospel as we are to secure our own security and enjoyment. Jesus appeals to the "children of light" to be as enterprising and resourceful in pursuit of reign of God as this steward is in making a place of himself in this world. We must restore money as the means to an end and not as the end itself; we are only stewards of our Master's property.
