Our Spiritual Journey

Our Lady of Fatima

Her Message and Relevance for Today

On Monday, 13 October, we processed with a statue of Our Lady of Fatima along Manly beach in celebration of the sixth and final day of Mary's apparition to the three shepherd children - Lucia, Jacinta and Francisco – in **Fatima, Portugal, in 1917**, during which thousands of people witnessed what is called **"the miracle of the sun"** – a miraculous phenomena seen by all those who were present on the day. However, you may be wondering, why do we still remember and celebrate the events surrounding this apparition, and **what is its significance, if any, for us today?**

Mary's message to the children reemphasised the Gospel call to **conversion, repentance, and prayer**. Mary calls humanity to **turn away from sin and return to God** – to stop offending God with our sin. She warns us that our sins and offenses towards God would result in wars and calamities, and the rise of anti-Christian and anti-God ideologies that would persecute the Church and Christians.

Mary asked that people **pray the Rosary daily** for peace in the world and for the conversion of sinners. She encouraged the children to make **small sacrifices** daily for the salvation of souls – as any suffering offered to God in union with the sufferings of Christ is very efficacious in the **salvation of souls** (CCC, 618; cf. Mt 16:24).

Pope John Paul II visited Fatima on three occasions, the first being on May 13, 1982, exactly one year after the **assassination attempt** on his life in 1981. He credited **Our Lady of Fatima with saving his life**. He encouraged devotion to the **Immaculate Heart of Mary**, and of **personal consecration to Mary** as a means of placing ourselves under Her **motherly protection**, and allowing Her to use us for the building of the kingdom of God on earth. **Pope Benedict XVI** also visited the Shrine at Fatima in 2010, and warned that the **prophetic mission of Fatima is not complete** but remains relevant for us today. We still face many **contemporary challenges** like **atheistic ideologies, secularism and moral relativism** that seek to displace God and His laws from humanity's hearts and from all public life.

For these reasons, our Parish community celebrated the feast of the Fatima apparition by processing – on a mini pilgrimage – along Manly beach towards Shelley beach and back with a statue of Our Lady of Fatima while praying the Rosary. A **procession symbolises our spiritual journey** through life. It is also a **public act of devotion**, and a small sacrifice on the part of pilgrims, which shows **our commitment to follow Mary's call** to conversion and repentance. It is also a **public witness to our faith**, a proclamation of **God's presence in the world** and especially in our secular society. Through procession we carry out our Divine mandate to preach the Good news, and to reclaim the right to use public spaces for prayer and evangelisation – reminding people of the need for conversion and repentance.

May **Our Lady of Fatima** bless us with the **grace of conversion and repentance**, and may She teach us to offer our **prayers and sufferings** for the salvation of souls, and for peace in the world. Amen.

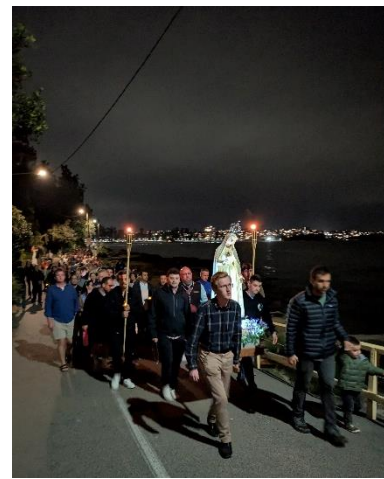

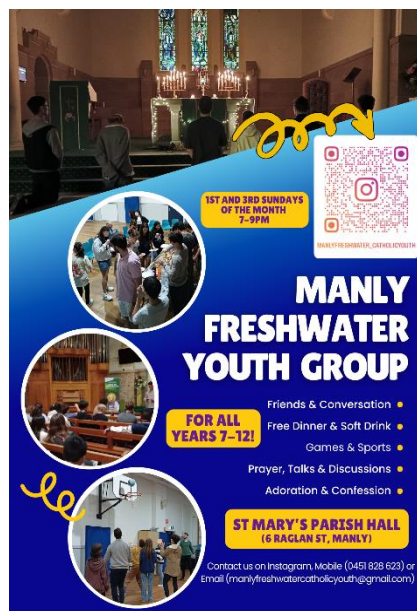

Pope's Prayer Intention for October 2025

For collaboration between different religious traditions Let us pray that believers in different religious traditions might work together to defend and promote peace, justice, and human fraternity.



Saint John Paul II is a particularly cherished saint for many. For many Catholics through the late 20th century, he was a constant part of their lives. Countless people across the globe would see him on television or hear his speeches, and some were even lucky enough to see him in person.

Born Karol Wojtyła in Poland in 1920 and living through the Nazi occupation of Poland during his early adulthood, he ascended to become Pope, serving as the Pontiff for almost three decades. As Pope, he visited Australia twice, once in 1986 and once in 1995, for the beatification of Saint Mary MacKillop. For many people in Australia, he is the only saint they would have ever seen in the flesh.

His feast day on October 22 represents a special day of devotion for many people, venerating a saint they knew and lived alongside.

Unlike most saints, who are venerated on their death date, Saint John Paul II is venerated on the date of his inauguration as Pope: October 22.

His inauguration in 1978 coincided with World Mission Sunday, which we celebrate this weekend. Saint John Paul II recognised World Mission Sunday as a critical day for the Church, which allowed it to renew its commitment to missionary work throughout the world.

It's fitting that the man who emphasised the universal call to holiness and traveled more widely than any Pope before him would be inaugurated on a day dedicated to renewing the Church's commitment to bringing the Gospel to every corner of the globe.

First Reading

Exodus 17:8-13 (JB)

A reading from the book of Exodus

As long as Moses kept his arms raised, Israel had the advantage.

The Amalekites came and attacked Israel at Rephidim. Moses said to Joshua, 'Pick out men for yourself, and tomorrow morning march out to engage Amalek. I, meanwhile will stand on the hilltop, the staff of God in my hand.' Joshua did as Moses told him and marched out to engage Amalek, while Moses and Aaron and Hur went up to the top of the hill. As long as Moses kept his arms raised, Israel had the advantage; when he let his arms fall, the advantage went to Amalek. But Moses' arms grew heavy, so they took a stone and put it under him and on this he sat, Aaron and Hur supporting his arms, one on one side, one on the other; and his arms remained firm until sunset. With the edge of the sword Joshua cut down Amalek and his people.

All scripture is inspired by God and can profitably be used for teaching, for refuting error, for guiding people's lives and teaching them to be holy. This is how the man who is dedicated to God becomes fully equipped and ready for any good work.

Before God and before Christ Jesus who is to be judge of the living and the dead, I put this duty to you, in the name of his Appearing and of his kingdom: proclaim the message

and, welcome or unwelcome, insist on it. Refute falsehood, correct error, call to obedience - but do all with patience and with the intention of teaching.

Luke 18:1-8 (JB)

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

God will see those who cry to him vindicated.

Jesus told his disciples a parable about the need to pray continually and never lose heart. 'There was a judge in a certain town' he said who had neither fear of God nor respect for man. In the same town there was a widow who kept coming to him and saying, "I want justice from you against my enemy!" For a long time he refused, but at last he said to himself "Maybe I have neither fear of God nor respect for man, but since she keeps pestering me I must give this widow her just rights, or she will persist in coming and worry me to death."

And the Lord said, 'You notice what the unjust judge has to say? Now will not God see justice done to his chosen who cry to him day and night even when he delays to help them? I promise you, he will see justice done to them, and done speedily. But when the Son of Man comes, will he find any faith on earth?'

The Gospel of the Lord.

GOSPEL REFLECTION

The judge in Jesus' parable read today is not one of the Jewish elders but a paid magistrate appointed by the Roman governors. These magistrates were notoriously corrupt, extorting money from plaintiffs to secure favorable verdicts. The widow, typically defenseless in such dealings, persists until the judge just wants to be rid of her.

Jesus does not liken God to the unfeeling, insensitive judge but *contrasts* God to him: If such persistence will finally move such an unfeeling and corrupt figure will not the God of mercy and love be moved by the cries of his own beloved people? The parable of the widow and the unjust judge (found only in Luke's Gospel) calls us to perseverance in prayer – prayer that seeks not to force God's hand but prayer that opens our hearts and minds to his always available grace.
